2022 Legislative Priorities

Move Redmond is the non-profit advocate for better streets, trails, and transit in Redmond. Our member organizations collectively represent the 100,000 people who go to work or school in Redmond. With nine out of ten people who work in Redmond living outside of the City, we work to make Redmond easy to reach from across the region. Our organization has worked in Redmond for over 30 years to make our community more accessible and inclusive.

Pass a Transportation Funding Package

Move Redmond supports the passage of a State Transportation Funding Package that prioritizes investments in streets, trails, and transit that make it easy to walk, bike, bus, and roll to the opportunities in Redmond. It is essential to achieve our community and state's climate change commitments and increase opportunity and equity in the state.

Projects we would like to see included in the package are:

- The **148**th **Ave SR 520 pedestrian and bike crossing**. We strongly support the City of Redmond in their ask on this project which will provide a safe connection for people who live and work in Redmond across SR 520.
- Funding for the Redmond Central Connector Phase III, which closes a gap in the Eastrail and provides a safe connection to the growing Willows Road corridor and light rail.

In addition to a transportation funding package, our legislative priorities are:

- Increase options for housing near transit to make is easier to reach opportunities in Redmond
- Funding to keep Stride I-405 Bus Rapid Transit on schedule
- Invest in accessible routes to light rail by expanding funding for ADA accessibility projects
- Investments to complete the Eastrail
- Expanded funding for transit operations to keep bus routes reliable
- Fund the WSDOT Active Transportation Plan to build safe routes to transit
- Additional local funding options for Transportation Benefit Districts
